

Trinity Episcopal Church is again hosting the annual community worship service "A Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols", Sunday, December 28 at 3:00 pm.

Our tradition has been to collect free will donations for a community need. This year we will be supporting the NEST Community Shelter in this effort to reduce homelessness in LaPorte County. The program follows the form presented yearly at King's College, Cambridge, England. The lessons read during the program are from the Old and New Testament foretelling the coming of the Messiah and the story of Jesus' birth. Each lesson is followed by a hymn and musical meditation presented by musicians from around the community. Following the program there will be a reception in the Episcopal Bishop's Mansion adjacent to Trinity Church.
